### Description

Learning, inside and outside schools, happens in interaction between children and their teachers, parents, and peers. It takes human interaction to learn to talk, to do math, to collaborate and to learn autonomously. Improving interaction is improving learning.

In the summer school Analyzing Classroom Interaction we take the challenge of exploring classroom interactions as they happen in real time.

We bring together the methodological expertise from the University of Groningen, as well as national and international colleagues, providing

you with approaches and methods used to understand educational interactions.

We will discuss all stages of a research project, from developing relevant research questions to publishing results, using different state-of-the-art-techniques that capture how interactions and learning are intertwined.

The summer school will be organized around lectures, applied workshops, data sessions, presentations of your own work, peer-feedback sessions, and above all, interesting academic discussions.
